The Library Board of Trustees and staff worked side-by-side to build a new website that is even more inclusive and allows WPL to be a 24/7 library.

We can't forget that it was just in June 2021 when the Library fully re-opened its doors, and since that time, we have welcomed all of you safely back with full service, as well as curbside service. We took advantage of the West Side Plaza to provide in-person programming with story hours, book discussions, concerts, art projects and more. In addition, we continued to use Zoom to provide virtual programming for adults, teens and children.

Offered a series of pop-up Library events at Marian Park




