


from the director





What is weeding?

To make space for new books, librarians must "weed" from our collection. We weed a book if it hasn't checked out in 4 years, has outdated information or is in poor condition. Every effort is made to replace weeded books with newer editions. Weeding makes it easier for you to find what you're looking for.



MOBILE PRINTING

Send a print job from your home computer or mobile device to the library. Release your color (25¢/page) or just black (10¢/page) print jobs at the Tech Center. Print jobs remain in the queue for 24 hours. wheatonlibrary.org/mobileprint


