





















from the director

What a year 2020 was for all of us. Together, we struggled to stay safe, connected and healthy. I am proud that Wheaton Public Library (WPL) worked closely with the City, schools and businesses by serving as a lifeline to provide virtual library services such as reference, storytimes, digital content, economic relief resources, webinars, Zoom programs, childcare and literacy tools and so much more while the Library doors were closed. As we slowly reopened, I was even more proud of how resilient the staff was in returning to work and how strongly they came together to build a Curbside and Grab & Go service that was able to successfully serve you safely, both inside and outside the Library.

This summer, we saw protests right outside the Library in our parking lot as well as Adams Park. Aligning with our mission statement that WPL is a welcoming destination, we offered and continue to offer several virtual programs focusing on issues of diversity, equity and inclusion. Wheaton was also hit with a strong derecho storm, which evolved into a tornado that touched down on the west side of the Library building. Thankfully, the damage was minor and everyone remained safe.

During November and December, the City Council and Library Board of Trustees supported an interior remodel project that allowed for us to create better socially distanced public and office spaces. The project also allowed for public service desks to be

equipped with safeguards to protect the staff when needed. Visitors will see the changes in full completion in February 2021.



I would be remiss to not remember the first quarter of 2020 before the world shut down. We had a great time partnering with the Wheaton Park District for the Library's first after-hours fundraiser, Mad Fore Plaid. We also were a successful grant recipient of a federal grant of \$10,000 to help shape Wheaton with the 2020 U.S. Census effort. Most importantly, we were proud to launch a new upgraded library catalog system called Polaris. Polaris gives Library users the simplest way to access and enjoy our collections.

It is with great pride that I present this remarkable 2020 Annual Report. I look at it with hope and excitement because I, along with the Library staff and Board members, plan to build on our 2020 successes as we shape the Library's future. Remember, my door is always open for you to share with me your thoughts, concerns or suggestions.

We began 2020 with the launch of Polaris, a Library Integrated System. This software solution offers powerful staff tools and an intuitive experience for patrons. When the library closed in March due to Covid restrictions, staff immediately jumped to the task of making library services available to patrons at home, including issuing library cards electronically and organizing online requests to be picked up curbside.

REFERENCE SERVICES

2020 brought changes to the way we answer questions for our patrons. Due to the library shutdown, we did not have any in-person interactions for several months during the year. However, changes made during reopening included routing all phone calls, emails and chats to the Adult Services Department. The increase in phone, email and chat questions reflects the continuing need for library services.

BUSINESS RESOURCE CENTER

When the pandemic hit and the library shut down in mid-March, the BRC began presenting programs virtually and added at least one job search program a month, including a popular 6-week job search series. In addition, programming co-hosted with SCORE restarted in June and the BRC offered a 3-part series on searching the business database, ReferenceUSA. The BRC has continued valuable partnerships with multiple local organizations.
